



THE STORY OF THE ZAYED SUSTAINABILITY PRIZE



As the world grapples with increasing environmental challenges, from pollution and dwindling water supplies to widespread hunger, energy deficits and climate change, the Zayed Sustainability Prize empowers changemakers to make a difference.

Established in 2008, the Zayed Sustainability Prize was created to honour Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan's commitment to sustainable development and humanitarianism. By recognising and rewarding innovators across core sustainability sectors, the Prize helps to build a more sustainable future for all.

Across the Prize's six categories: Health, Food, Energy, Water, Climate Action and Global High Schools, the lives of **384** million people have been impacted by the sustainable actions and solutions of the past **117** Prize winners.

GLOBAL HIGH SCHOOLS CATEGORY

The Global High Schools category was introduced in 2012. This category awards six high schools, from six world regions, that can demonstrate a project plan that will deliver impact, innovation and inspiration to their school and/or local community. Schools must propose projects to be implemented within 12-24 months of receiving the Prize, with tangible outcomes in the areas of sustainable health, food, energy and water.

These projects should be designed to deliver positive impact, including access to quality education, and ensuring students are given key skills and enhanced abilities to achieve their goals.

Ideally, projects should demonstrate new and innovative approaches and be inspirational for others. Winning schools will be awarded US \$150,000 to transform their sustainability visions into reality.

The Global High Schools category's six world regions are:

- 1. The Americas
- 2. Sub-Saharan Africa
- 3. Middle East & North Africa

- 4. Europe & Central Asia
- 5. South Asia
- 6. East Asia & Pacific



MAKING AN IMPACT THROUGH THE GLOBAL HIGH SCHOOLS CATEGORY

Everyone has the power to make a difference. We recognise that many of the world's best ideas — those that will create a more sustainable future — begin with our youth. The Global High Schools category was created to empower students to take action and make their sustainable projects a reality.

You can submit your project on our dedicated online portal.
Your school can register on our website and follow the steps below:

- Set up a student-led project team, which can be made up of students, teachers, administrators as well as parents and/or members of your community
- Research potential sustainability projects and talk to experts
- Set up a project plan and explain what you want to do and how much it will cost
- Familiarise yourself with the submission process, online portal and fill out the form
- When you are satisfied with all the details on the entry form, click the submit button

If you do not wish to submit all information in one sitting, you may save the information and return to it at any time before the final submission date.
